- Can add Table of Contents to lengthy documents



- Ability to “follow” others (a la Twitter)






# Editing Your Personal Homepage

- Click on “Your View” and then “personalize”
- First choose your desired column layout
- And then drag-&-drop widgets that you prefer



# Editing Your Personal Homepage


- The widgets will offer more information when dropped into a wider column



- Or a widget to set your current status (a la Facebook), and view that of others





- You can even install a widget that tracks your tasks (and sends email reminders)...



# New Rich Text Editor

- The wiki-syntax formatting tags are no longer necessary. All code-highlighting and formatting is now performed through the toolbar.
- To enable a Table of Contents, make sure each section title is created with a “Header” style. Then move the cursor to the top of the document, and use the menu shown above to insert the table.




# New Rich Text Editor (cont'd)

- To create a linkable heading within any document, switch to the HTML editor. Insert an id="`<MyID>`" in the appropriate HTML header tag. Now you can link to this heading using the DOC URL followed by the `#<MyID>` tag.



# Expanded Personal Profiles


- Your profile can contain much more information now, such as occupation, expertise, and even a short biography, if you choose to share it. This may help you locate others with common interests, and facilitate collaboration.
- A mini-profile pops up whenever you hover over an avatar. Click on it to see their complete profile page
- You can “follow” them by clicking the link on the right column
